While working on their project, students are expected to model the principles of servant leadership by helping those in need, equipping others, and changing our community for the better.

For the upcoming year, the senior class of the Servant Leadership Program at Columbus State University is partnering with Fox Elementary to serve the various neighborhoods of the Mill District community. The Class of 2024 will spend their time, energy, and resources serving the highest priority needs of Fox Elementary. As such, Fox Elementary will be the primary benefactor of the proceeds from this year's Uptown Tree Trail.

The Seniors want to help increase access to and opportunity for the next generation of the Mill District community members by investing the funds they raise to provide programming for students and their families. The Class of 2024 plans to offer resources and workshops for the students and families of Fox Elementary in order to create a better environment for all to learn and grow in various ways.

The Class of 2024 has encompassed its goals for its year-long project with the slogan "Expand, Equip, Expose." This slogan reflects their desire to increase access to health education and services, opportunities for community engagement and participation, and awareness of the importance of education. UPTOWN TREE TRAIL

Uptown Tree Trail is a display of live Christmas trees through the heart of Uptown Columbus during the holiday season (December through the beginning of January). Uptown Tree Trail is rooted in philanthropy and community. Each tree is sponsored by a local family, business, or organization and can be decorated by its sponsor or another designated group. Proceeds from tree purchases will go to benefit non-profit organizations in the Columbus, Georgia community.

Uptown Tree Trail will begin with a kick-off celebration on the first Friday of December, following the annual tree lighting in Uptown. Throughout December, CSU Servant Leadership students, Buck Field Christmas Trees, and Uptown, Inc. will help maintain the trees.
